

"Stüdyolar"ın bu sayısı İzmir Yüksek Teknoloji Enstitüsü, Mimarlık Bölümünde 2017-2018 akademik yılında, lisans programında yürütülen stüdyolardan seçilen öğrenci çalışmalarından oluşmaktadır. Bireysel olduğu kadar kolektif bir emeği de sunduğuna inandığımız bu çalışmalar aynı zamanda okulumuzda tasarım stüdyolarının ortak paydasını da sergiliyorlar: İnsan ve Yaşam Odaklı Tasarım Anlayış.

AR201 involves the design of a mixed-use building while exploring the intersections of material, experience and space. The course covers body/material/space relations both in public and individual spaces concerning exhibition and display.

The course will have two major parts; starting with a short design project (an exhibition space), students are then expected to carry out one final project during the semester.

1st PHASE – UNDERSTANDING ARTWORK AND DISPLAY

Each student will select either a Turkish painter or sculptor from the given list. For the first phase the aim is to understand the selected art work, the processes of thinking and its spatial needs. The students will analyze and present the work process of each artist and elaborate on the design and sensorial dimensions of materials. The end project will be a minimum space ca 216m3 designed in IYTE Campus.

We will dwell upon questions of art work, thinking, sensorial relations in space.

2nd PHASE - REPRESENTING THE CITY OF BERGAMA

The students will design an exhibition complex at a given sites in Bergama. BERGAMA is an Aegean town that has been continuously inhabited beginning from the early ages.

It is a multilayered city that includes a historical stratification which occurs from Hellenistic, Roman, Byzantium periods and Karesi Beyliği,

Ottoman and The Republic of Turkey. Bergama is included in the World Heritage List in the year of 2014.

Today, the city is in the urban development process with its historical heritage.

The studio works must take into consideration and solve the spatial arrangement of public and private activities, spatial relations, and their integration with the urban context.

Definition of the Project

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This section of the AR201 studio has been an effort in research-based design, focused on ecological design at the urban scale and at the building scale. We worked in the Basmane area of Izmir, near Anafartalar Street.

We have attempted to understand the adaptive strategies seen in local plants and in traditional building forms of this region, to use these ideas in contemporary design. With biology professor Anne Frary of IYTE we looked at forms and mechanisms found in local plants, to try to understand how they achieve resource efficiency, water conservation and storage, insulation, light control, etc. We examined samples of local plants with IYTE's scanning electron microscope. Together with architect Kadir Ozturk of the Izmir Municipality we looked at historic buildings in the Basmane neighborhood of Izmir, and attempted to understand the adaptations of this vernacular architecture to the local climate and soil conditions. We met with Basmane community social workers Yelda Şimşek and Duygu Öz to learn about the demographics of the neighborhood and its current needs, especially the needs of its refugee population which has swelled in recent years.

Each student proposed an infill project of a public nature, approx. 500 m2. The students chose three sites that are close to the pedestrian artery of Anafarta-lar Street. The specifics of the architectural program were determined by each student. The structural system was an integral part of the design. Students prepared a booklet of design ideas taken from local plants and vernacular architecture. The students worked in groups to analyze the three sites and construct 1:200 models of the sites. The project was developed at scale 1:100. Proposals were expected to be both appropriate to the context and innovative








QUESTIONING THE WORKPLACE: A CENTER FOR COLLABORATIVE PRACTICE

A report on work in the 21st century "... identified three trends with important implications for the future of work: a shifting demography toward older workers, more women, and more diversity; continuing technological change that would increase demand for skilled workers across a wide array of industries and occupations; and increased globalization in sectors." What was once known as "work," from the seemingly simple manual labor to more skilled white-collar jobs in the 19th century has changed and is diversified dramatically today due to the global synchronization of capitalist activity and the advances in technological infrastructure.

The forces of global capitalism and changes in technology are expected to have a direct bearing on the shape of the workplace. While certain visionaries assume that the workplace of the future is going to be less centralized, more mobile, and more flexible; others argue that centralization of the workforce enhances productivity and creativity.


In this project, we will ask you to design a center for collaborative practice, where people from different professions will be able to come together, or sometimes on their own, to work in the newly developing business center of Bayraklı, Izmir. You are asked to question the workplace of today and imagine a new environment for the near future.

What are the main criteria that shapes the workplace of today? Hierarchy? Efficiency? Transparency? Surveillance and discipline? Competition? What kind of work environment would you like to experience when you start your career? A sense of community encouraging dialogue vs. a sense of utmost privacy that caters for maximum concentration? What are the infrastructural needs of the workplace for production and productivity? A research environment? A busy hub of people? Facilities for testing ideas and demonstrating them? Or should all of these be spread around the city? A place that lives 24/7 or a castle that locks its doors after 5:30 during the week. These are only a limited number of issues that we hope to address during this semester, and we hope that all of you will be giving well-thought answers to these question and develop creative solutions.

























Definition of the Project

Bornova district is located in the heart of Izmir city. European/Levantine merchants and foreign consuls favored Bornova very early on to flee the hot summer weather in central Izmir to seek the cooler breeze of the slopes of the Mount "Yamanlar" at a distance of about five kilometers inland starting from the tip of the Gulf of İzmir. Bornova today has various ethnic typology (migrants from Bulgaria, Yugoslav, Bosnian, Albanian, etc.). The population majority of Bornova are youth under the age of 25. Furthermore, Bornova has two major universities; Ege and Yasar. The district also faces into rapid transformation in housing developments, especially with mix used commercial and housing tower, which brings about even higher population to Izmir. Bornova is on the way of top attractive center for the new appearance of Izmir.

Bornova Municipality is the creative institution which always open to the inclusion new facilities to regenerate the Bornova district, and carry it to the future aspects of the 21st era. Therefore, the Municipality welcomes the topic of "Academy of Digital Arts and Animation Centre", perceives this project as the service area for the public use of not only for Bornova citizens, but also for the community of Izmir. The project should serve for people from any age to accommodate this new function for Izmir.

The designated land for this project deserves a special attention where the strong public belt next to Mustafa Kemal Street locating on the east – west direction from the core of Bornova to the area of Bayraklı towers and seashore

located in the area. The public belt starts with Peterson Mansion, which will be converted into Culture Center by the Greater Municipality of Izmir, then continues with another Culture Center. The west side of this public belt ends with Bornova stadium, where the Municipal Service Building of Bornova will be erected. The public belt is also supported by the green belt. The dense housing fabric encloses the project area, and becomes the definitive factor for out project. In addition, the Aşık Veysel Recreation Area, close by to the north of the project area, and the Bornova Small and Big Parks at the southeast of the project area, should provide essential inputs for your designs.

Please also consider the IZBAN metro station on the south for its pedestrian approach, and Izmir Ring Road on the west for the vehicle approach both constituting the strong connection of site to Izmir people.


The building shall respond to the context of its location with a sustainable concept design. Therefore, you should consider environmental (orientation, topography, climate, pollution, noise, green area, roads transportation [vehicle, public, pedestrian], existing materials), economic background of site, Bornova and Izmir, and socio-cultural structure of site, Bornova and Izmir.
















Definition of the Project

To develop an insight into the reasons for the shortcomings of the built environment of the contemporary city and a concern for the effect of the design of individual buildings on the larger, city-scale environment;


To consider the uses of public and communal spaces;

To enable teams composed of students of architecture and city planning to work together on both highlighting the assets and solving the problems of settlements in different scales.



The studios of first, second and fourth grade house the partnership formed with the City and Regional Planning Department and this cooperation develop the theoretical background and sensitivity of our students on urban and environmental issues. By the help of our visiting instructors, a communicative bridge is formed between the studio and the practical world of architecture. On the other hand, with their enormous labour and never-ending energy in the studio, our beloved students keep on transforming this educational venue day by day into a critical and creative platform of production.

"Stüdyolar"ın bu sayısı İzmir Yüksek Teknoloji Enstitüsü, Mimarlık Bölümünde 2017-2018 akademik yılında, lisans programında yürütülen stüdyolardan seçilen öğrenci çalışmalarından oluşmaktadır. Bireysel olduğu kadar kolektif bir emeği de sunduğuna inandığımız bu çalışmalar aynı zamanda okulumuzda tasarım stüdyolarının ortak paydasını da sergiliyorlar: İnsan ve Yaşam Odaklı Tasarım Anlayış.

Definition of the Project

This studio's main objectives include: exploring the challenges presented by a non-urban site, analyzing a rural settlement and a site in a natural and historical environment, tackling a complex building program while considering the mass and orientation of the building or the building complex and circulation. In addition, you are expected to master the relationships between interior and exterior space; open, semi-open and closed space; and between public and private spaces in the given rural context.

This semester you will work individually on a single project and be responsible of developing a design idea from an initial concept to a complete project. Along the way you will be developing necessary skills and knowledge about site planning and design, plan and section development, program analysis, and structural solutions.

We aim to further develop awareness of design dimensions such as materials and integration to the site.

Working on a rural site, which is in a unique natural-historical environment, the studio aims to develop your sensitivities toward socio-cultural, architectural, historical contexts that are intertwined in this case, such as the one we will be working on this semester.

There are also challenges that come with the nature of the building program.



Definition of the Project

"The AR202 course is intended to introduce the concepts of rural and natural environment and explore methods for understanding place in a natural context. It should also include analysis of an architectural program, inquiry into the effects of a natural or rural environment on architectural design, and presentation techniques."

In this section of AR202 the students completed three proposals for architectural projects in natural areas: a warm-up project for a beach site, a short project for a rocky mountaintop, and a long project for the shores of Lake Bafa.

To introduce the topic of "Designing in Nature", during Weeks 1 and 2 the students made quick proposals for a simple Kite Surf Center in Gülbahçe. The program for this preliminary exercise included only storage for several surf schools, a common cafe, and changing areas and wcs.

The students did research on the Bafa Lake-Herakleia-Latmos region and created a booklet to use as a reference during a class trip to the region. The class travelled to Milas during Week 3 to visit the sites for the short and long projects. Milas writer Olcay Akdeniz guided the class on a hike in the Latmos mountains to see the archaic rock paintings. The class also visited Alatepe near the coastal village of Ören and saw Milas vernacular houses and other historic sites in the Milas city center.

During Weeks 3 through 6 the students made design proposals for a Paragliding Center for Alatepe, near Ören. The program included a café, forest ranger tower, classroom, changing facilities, and wcs, and was approx. 150-200 sq. m. Some of these projects can be seen in the studio area in the 2nd floor hall of B Blok. Professor Anne Frary from IYTE's Molecular Biology department made a presentation to the class about adaptations to drought and heat that can be seen in plants and animals.


During Weeks 7 through 13 the students prepared design proposals for an Interpretive Center for the Bafa Lake-Herakleia-Latmos region. Ayça Tunç Cox from our Industrial Design Department made a presentation to the class about poster design. The students have been encouraged to develop individual program ideas that could create sustainable economic benefits for the area and increase awareness of its natural resources and cultural riches. Each proposal should be approx. 2000 sq. m.

Program elements that all proposals should include are: Exhibition space, a Café, a Large Group meeting room, a Classroom, Housing for researchers and visitors, various Workshops, toilets, and storage. The students presented their site observations, project goals, and program ideas at the second Midterm, then proceeded with site design and building design. A pre-final review was held during Week 12.



Definition of the Project

This semester's project has aimed to convert the abandoned Sumerbank complex in the Alsancak harbour area of Izmir into a living environment serving a multiplicity of functions including housing while responding to the value of the complex as industrial heritage.

In 2012, Izmir Metropolitan Municipality's Department of Historic Environment and Cultural Heritage prepared a proposal for the conversion of the Sümerbank Area into a cultural complex that is connected to the Izmir International Fair through a pedestrian and cycling route.

This proposal has served as a basis for our studio to introduce residential units and their social, cultural and commercial infrastructure into the area. Part of these proposed functions have been accommodated in existing Sumerbank buildings, or in new blocks giving reference to its pre-existing components that have been documented in various academic studies.


Since the Sümerbank complex is located on large plot, measuring roughly 155,000 m2, the studio has been organised in groups working in three separate zones that have different characteristics and potentials.

Student groups of 3 first developed a sitescale scenario introducing housing and social amenities into the public uses drafted in the municipal proposal. Each student then develop her/his own project independently, on the basis of the experience in group work.


In addition to a housing complex, consisting of about 4 different types of housing units with an overall floor area of around 8,000 m2 plus circulation and open spaces for their residents, each student will be expected to focus on a selected social or cultural use of some 2,000 m2 in their individual proposal as outlined in their group scenario. Individual proposal should also have adequate closed and open parking areas, and common mechanical services.


















Definition of the Project

The master and doctorate students of IYTE constitute the base for the research activities in the Institute. Their satisfaction and productivity is strongly influenced by their living and working conditions in or out of IYTE. Therefore, there is an urgent need to create a proper accommodation conditions.

The half of all students in IYTE, nearly 3000 by 2016, are the graduate (master and doctorate) ones from different disciplines. Their needs and expectations from an accommodation complex differ. The proposed project should consider this variety / diversity in a manner of complexity and/or simplicity. Within the perspective of constructing housing in a public university, the project should deal with the economic part of sustainable design which convince IYTE administrators for their future plans.

The campus area still continues to keep its natural character from its special location next to mountains and sea. The natural sources (climate, material, flora, topography, etc.) should provide richness to project ideas. Even if IYTE is situated away from the city center, it creates semi-urban fabric in the core of very natural land. The project provides a good discussion base for criticizing human – nature relationship, and the role of architecture as a part of ecological ideas.

The inquires with the master and PhD students in IYTE indicate that some of students have expectations from a house just in the level of meeting minimum needs like sleeping and heating. This fact reminds us that the students in early ages or living single may prefer micro-housing designs which is an open concept to be studied in the student village project. The inquires, plus, show us the students tend to stay for particular periods such as weekdays (not weekends), or during fall and spring semesters (not summer period). Some may also prefer the housing in IYTE as the summer house for sea season. Since master education should finish in three years while Phd in six years, a student can rend a house at most nine years. Besides, a student can change his/her house if she/he marry or stay within couple. All these approaches require the study of temporal, transient, transitory topics in housing.


The social life in IYTE requires to be developed. The scientific studies are heavy, and many students don't have any possibility to contact with other people, or conduct personal hobbies. The housing complex should enrich the social life of residents, increase socialization in open, semi-open and closed areas.

The proposed new community must relate well to its existing urban context, both architecturally and functionally. The site design and all buildings in your new development should be energy-saving and adapted to the IYTE climate. Use landscaping to shape space and for passive heating and cooling. Besides, the project should offer new idea for housing environmentally, socially, and economically. There are two given sites with respect to the character of each one.

Definition of the Project

RECREATING "PARADISE": A NEW URBAN HUB FOR ŞİRİNYER

Shopping, commerce, and transportation are major services of an urban environment. Often these services contribute together to the richness of urban life. When the built environment provides adequate spatial alternatives to shopping, commerce, and transportation, the interactions between people increases and other social amenities and services conglomerate around them.

Recent developments, especially in our country, however, points to a different direction. Open urban areas dedicated to street markets and transfer centers are turned into high-end shopping malls, as in Üçkuyular. Shopping and commerce are increasingly confined within the boundaries of malls, either in the form of shopping malls or strip malls, offering services to a selected group of people and isolating themselves from the rest of the city. Increased and diversified public transportation alternatives, on the other hand, are either pushed away from urban environment or their spatial configuration do not add to the urban life, as in many transfer stations between metrobus lines, city bus lines, and metro lines in Istanbul. In this project, we would like to revisit the proposal that shopping, commerce, and transportation all together are three major backbones of a rich urban environment, or of an urban hub, to which other major services could easily be incorporated.

Our selected site is in Şirinyer, which functions as an urban hub in Buca, and houses a major retail store, a street market open twice a week, a bus transfer center near the Şirinyer İzban station, in addition to several other amenities such as sports facilities, a wedding hall etc...


Maybe because of its stately mansions with beautiful gardens, Paradiso, or "Paradise," was the name used for Şirinyer by the 19th century Levan-

tines of Izmir. Home to the "International College" which was relocated to Beirut due to the start of World War 1, and to the spectacle of the earliest horse races in the Ottoman Empire, Şirinyer presents an astounding, but simultaneously confounding history. Having witnessed drastic urban development in the last fifty years this history is barely visible today. Nevertheless, it is still a very important urban center for contemporary Izmir. The area you will be asked to redesign is now called "Şirinyer Aktarma Merkezi" referring to the transportation exchange located in the area, north of the hippodrome. At the present "the center" is largely defined by traffic routes and a number of activities spread in the area, giving a sense of disarray and a lack of spatial definition. In contrast people come to the area for various activities such as shopping and recreation, and also due to the existence of certain social functions placed in the area by the municipality. The project requires you to design an urban hub that primarily accommodate shopping and transportation facilities together with additional functions, which will address the problems identified in your analysis of the area.



Definition of the Project

AR 402 is the last architectural design studio of the architectural curriculum at IYTE. In spring semester 2018, students are asked to develop an architectural design project questioning the relation between the nature and the future of the city in İzmir.

STUDIO STRUCTURE PART 1. DISCOURSES

Whole population living in the cities in Turkey is nearly 92%. The consequences of over-urbanization are over-consumption, lack of land, lack of resources, etc. Within the scope of the studio, first step is to understand the city through its actual natural resources, potentials and richnesses. Main concern of the studio is to understand how and why we destroy the nature.

Therefore, the question is: Can we develop a critical reaction against destroying nature through architecture?

PART 2. DISCUSSIONS

Second part of the studio deals with the questions and interrogations of discourses determined in the first part for developing a design idea.

How the cities are developing?

How can we produce an activist attitude for the destroying the nature through human?


