

"Stüdyolar"ın bu sayısı İzmir Yüksek Teknoloji Enstitüsü, Mimarlık Bölümünde 2016-2017 akademik yılında, lisans programında yürütülen stüdyolardan seçilen öğrenci çalışmalarından oluşmaktadır. Bireysel olduğu kadar kolektif bir emeği de sunduğuna inandığımız bu çalışmalar aynı zamanda okulumuzda tasarım stüdyolarının ortak paydasını da sergiliyorlar: İnsan ve Yaşam Odaklı Tasarım Anlayış.

AR201 involves the design of a mixed-use building while exploring the intersections of material, experience and space. It examines the poetics of space and the poetics of craftsmanship. The course covers body/material/space relations both in public and individual spaces.

The course will have two major parts; starting with a short design project (a working space for a young professional), students are then expected to carry out one final project during the semester.

1st PHASE - UNDERSTANDING PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE & CRAFTSMANSHIP

Each student will select a profession, such as architecture, philosophy, engineering, education, fine arts, etc. For the first phase the aim is to understand the selected profession, the processes of thinking and production, its connections to other fields, and its spatial needs.

The students will record, analyze, and present the work process of each profession; explore the process of understanding and learning by doing; and elaborate on the design and sensorial dimensions of materials.

2nd PHASE - DESIGNING A WORK SPACE FOR 4 PROFESSIONALS

The students will design a workshop complex at a given site in Izmir. Alsancak as the competitive heart of the city center will be explored in terms of its accessibility and adaptability to the young professionals. After discussing the development history and dynamics of the city center, we will select an urban void to become a place of adaptation and integration for professional needs. The studio works must take into consideration and solve the spatial arrangement of public and private activities, spatial relations, and integration with the urban context.



















AR201 is the first architectural design studio of the architectural curriculum at IYTE. In this section of AR201 students are asked to develop one short-term and a final long-term project.

DESIGN PHASES

Design studio 201 juxtaposes three related topics: sense, experience anda space. The course addresses a variety of spatial relations, including different types of urban activities and users. It will have three major stages; starting with the understanding of the site, students are then expected to design two projects, a short-term one and an extensive final one.

1.UNDERSTANDING THE SITE

Students will explore the potentials of the site and develop initial design ideas for Project 1. During this phase, historical overview, transportation, pedestrian access, activities, land uses, environmental factors will be considered and visual and sensory analysis will be pursued.

2.MICRO INTERVENTIONS INTO PUBLIC SPACE

Based on the results of the sitestudy, students will locate specific spatial problems and develop design solutions.

3.GENERATIONS - SOCIAL CENTER AT MITHATPAŞA DR. BEHÇET UZ PARK


The students will design a Social Center near Dr. Behçet Uz Park at Mithatpaşa especially addressing the daily social needs of the users of the park.




















The AR201 course is the first architectural design studio in the undergraduate program at IYTE. It is intended to address the topics of space planning, ergonomics and accessibility, diagrammatic representation, analysis and programming, the relation of structure and space, climatic performance, scale, understanding a place in an urban context, concepts of public and private space, and presentation techniques. The project is a public building with a simple architectural program in accordance with a design idea.

This section of AR201 worked in the village of Birgi/Ödemiş, with the theme of ecological design. We began by gathering information about different aspects of Birgi, such as its geology, climate, infrastructure, demographics, culture, and history. We researched Birgi's indigenous plants, the form of the vernacular settlement, and its tradtional building types, looking for adaptive strategies that might inform new architecture in Birgi. Professor Mine Turan from IYTE's Restoration Department made a presentation to the class about the morphology of the historic settlement and its traditional building types.

The class constructed a 1:500 scale model to represent the form of the settlement, which is in two parts facing each other across a stream.

Professor Anne Frary of IYTE's Biology Department talked to the class about adaptations seen in plants, using samples we collected from the IYTE campus. We visited Birgi together with Professor Frary. During this trip the students made sketches and photos of their observations, and we collected native plant samples.


Each student chose a vacant or underused parcel within Birgi and proposed a new program for the site. Upon return each student made 1:100 drawings and model of his or her parcel.

We looked at the plant samples under the scanning electron microscope at IYTE's Materials Research Center, with the help of MAM technicians, and Professor Frary commented on the functions of the microscopic structures we observed. After this research was completed each student created a list of general ecological principles for Birgi and used these guidelines to for a small infill project with a public function.

After the second Midterm we returned to Birgi to gather additional information about the parcels. Parcel designs were developed in 1:50 scale models. Proposals were ex-





Definition of the Project

You must have heard from your elders that their childhood was much too different. They would tell you about the open fields on which they would run freely without car sounds and pollution, the trees they climbed, the fruit they picked as the day's trophy. They would tell you that they played with toys of their own making and how happy they felt when they outsmarted their friends in the games they played in the yard. They would also tell you of the festival in the town where they went and watched the clowns, the acrobats and the sweets their grandparents bought them. Naturally generations enjoy different childhoods and our experiences of growth make us who we are. While those experiences highly shape our adulthood, we vividly remember the spaces that we visited, inhabited, played and lived during our lives as children.

What about today, in the urban environments that we share with our children? It is not wrong to say that children make up a large number of the underprivileged in our cities. While cities don't offer adequate spaces specifically planned for children, they spend most of their time indoors yearning for their guardians to come and take them to a playground, a park or the gym if their families can afford it. Those that go to school spend most of their time in urban transportation in the so-called service bus moving from the spaces of the school to the spaces of their homes. They lack creative play time involving their body and imagination, while they socialize and learn. They have a life restricted to shopping malls, poorly-designed play grounds which are almost the same everywhere, and schools that may not even have a yard.

In this project it is asked to design a center for children in the city, for activity, performance and everything else that children might need or demand where they will delightfully spend their inexhaustible energy: a place of play for "kids" and those who never forgot playing



























































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

Definition of the Project



Definition of the Project

This Urban Design Studio introduces students in the Departments of Architecture and City Planning to the approaches, techniques, and tools of urban design necessary to structure the spatial and dimensional relationships of the built environment. The multi-disciplinary nature of urban design studio offers an opportunity to establish a co-working, which will link the two departments more closely to their mutual enrichment, and to the benefit of the Faculty of Architecture.

THE PROJECT THEME: Responsible Tourism

The global development of mass tourism activities has brought negative impacts to host cities and regions that cause degradation of natural reserves, commercialization of culture, creating noise, air pollution and waste, and rising cost of local services. Today local development agendas meet creative economy, experience economy and sharing economy that imply users' attitude that move from consuming to collaborating with the social, cultural, and physical environment for both its sustainability and development. There is a changing conception of tourist consuming places to creative/responsible tourist or traveler mentality that may reduce and help to renovate the fragile natural and local cultural systems: responsible travel to natural areas that conserves the environment, sustains the well-being of the local people. This requires innovative way of seeing all this human interaction with nature based on environment preservation goals. With this regard, this studio explores potentials and the limits of responsible and creative tourism within the frame of urban design

THE PROJECT SITE: DALAMAN

This semester, Urban Design Studio aims to focus on the city of Dalaman, county of Muğla Province. Dalaman is a small town with a growing population of 37.000 (2015 data). Thanks to Dalaman Airport, the city is gateway to its region, especially to popular tourism destinations such as Marmaris, Fethiye, Göcek and Dalyan.

Using this opportunity, Dalaman Weekend Project has recently initiated to attract domestic travel to those tourism regions.

Dalaman's transportation hub position makes the city a transient place. The Urban Design Studio will explore to ways of making Dalaman a lively place to stay by customizing the tourism (against the mass tourism around the region).

Within this framework, the possible project topics included but not limited to, the followings:


- •Town center projects: creating vitalized and healthy urban living and quality of place in the central part of the Dalaman
 - •Cultural and Social projects: includes vacant facilities and lack of public utilities in and around the town
- Customizing tourism activities: Dalaman is home to alternative tourism activities such as rafting, trekking and cycling. Thermal springs and associated wellness
 tourism could be considered. Also, state-owned large farm (called TİGEM) has valuable urban farming and cultural properties (Alexandria railway station built by
 mistake in Dalaman).
- • Waterfront and Blue Network projects: The city is located on a large part of the fertile plain supported by many streams like Dalaman Stream. City's seaside can also be considered for further sustainable development.
- Transport hub and nearby regions: Dalaman Airport's relations with the city and associated tourism facilities and mass housing areas should be considered.

Definition of the Project

Objectives:

Basic methods of documentation and analysis for the natural and built environment; • Physical and social definitions of space and place; • Collective site and studio work for grasping spatial relations in the natural and built environment in the human scale and their enhancement for simple uses; • Individual studio practices integrating spatial organization with construction skills.

Definition of the Project

AR 202 dwells on the question: Does architecture could help autistic people, or other disablednpopulations, gain independence? How?

According to Magda Mostafa, a pioneer in autism design, independence needs to be the objective of all accessibility and inclusion design strategies. It is more comprehensive than access, since it also includes usability:

"If you think of the primary problem of autism being understanding, coping with and responding to the sensory environment, you can grasp the power of architecture in their everyday lives. The built environment provides the large majority of sensory input- light, acoustics, textures, colors, spatial configurations, ventilation etc. By manipulating the design of the environment we can manipulate that all-so-important sensory input."

A special education campus located at the country, rather than at the inner-city as a highstimuli environment, already hints to favor a certain pedagogic approach in autism design. However, the students are asked to elaborate their own arguments and particular approaches towards pedagogical issues within an exploratory mode.

GENERAL OBJECTIVES

The primary objectives of the studio are as follows:

To introduce the concepts, terms and methods for understanding a place within a natural context.

To realize necessary studio practices for providing the analysis of an architectural program including public, semi-public and private spaces.

To inquire the effects of a natural or rural environment to architectural design.

To develop necessary skills and knowledge about program analysis, site/landscape planning and design, plan and section development and structural solutions.

To develop necessary skills and knowledge about presenting and expressing ideas.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

To develop an understanding of design for persons with disabilities, especially the special needs users with developmental and psychosocial disorders such as autism spectrum disorder.


To deal with the problem of creating a "controlled environment" within a natural environment that helps the adaptation of autistic individuals to less-controlled environments.

Studio objectives & Content



This studio's main objectives include: exploring the challenges presented by a non-urban site, analyzing a rural settlement and a site in a natural and historical environment, tackling a complex building programme while considering mass composition and circulation, and developing a design idea from an initial concept to a complete project. In addition, you are expected to work on relationships between interior and exterior space; open, semi-open and closed space; and between public and private spaces in the given rural context. Along the way you will be developing necessary skills and knowledge about site planning and design, plan and section development, program analysis, and structural solutions.

We aim to further develop awareness of design dimensions such as orientation, materials and integration to the site. Working on a rural site, in a unique natural-historical environment, the studio aims to develop students' sensitivities towards issues such as intervention into a natural environment.

Definition of the Project

Studio description

The area of our design study was the forest village of Yağcılar (İzmir). We began the semester with visits to Yağcılar and to metalworking and woodworking studios in İzmir.

The class constructed a 1:500 site model of the village (for 5% of the course grade) and then prepared two design projects.

The subject of the first design project was guest houses for visiting artists, to be located on specified sites within the village. Students worked in groups of 3 or 4 to do site documentation and propose a site plan for the insertion of several guest houses into the fabric of Yağcılar. Each student then developed the design of one of the guest houses proposed in the common plan. Duration of this project was five weeks. This work was evaluated at the First Midterm for 25% of the semester grade.

An arts workshop complex was the subject of the second design project. This complex is to be located on a small, rocky hill that overlooks Yagcılar from the north and is adjacent to a forest. Students were asked to develop the program of this arts complex individually, based on topics of study that each student chose to include (e.g., woodworking, painting, ceramics).

Required program elements:

One group workshop for each topic of study
Three individual studios for each topic of study
One classroom for each topic, suitable for data show
A lecture hall for large groups
Children's workshop areas for each topic of study
Exhibition areas
A common dining facility, with kitchen and storage
A management office

Development of outdoor spaces was strongly emphasized, because of the favorable climate of this region. Students were asked to preserve the natural state of the hill as much as possible and to protect and develop the biodiversity of the site. Students were encouraged to develop the project program so as to improve the long-term ecological health and resilience of Yagcılar.
















Definition of the Project

AR 302 is the fourth architectural design studio of the architectural curriculum at Iztech. This semester students studied two projects. Throughout the semester they worked individually without forgetting that they would also be part of a larger group of students and instructors thinking through the same problem. The studio environment was more productive when it became a platform to share ideas and questions.

This semester students studied housing and how it relates to urban environment at different scales and from different points of focus. Throughout the semester, they worked on larger scale issues (1/1000 and 1/500) to inquire how housing projects relate and contribute to their immediate urban surroundings and how they could create public and semi-public urban spaces. They also focused on smaller scale issues (1/200 and 1/50) studying how individual units of different sizes are brought together, how privacy issues are addressed, and how spaces of different functions are inhabited.

We choose the houses that we live in after we answer many questions: Can we afford it? How does it look like? Is the location suitable? How long are we going to occupy it? What kind of life are we going to live inside it? A family's? A young urban professional's? A student's? A migrant's? A worker's? The needs, lifestyles and priorities of people make a house more than a shelter, and the complexities of people's lives influence the environments that they live in. This condition reflects on architecture in several ways which adds to the variety of architectural solutions around us regarding housing.


This project will explore the conditions of inhabiting architectural space for those who spend most of their times in education and of developing design solutions for such lives. The academic community in Bandırma University have decided to live closer to the city center, and in a reachable distance from the campus. This community is comprised of several user profiles such as research assistants who are graduate students, professors that study, teach and do research, and staff who work on the administrative problems of the academic community. Cliché housing solutions that surround us in our everyday lives like the 3+1 or the recent 1+1 formula that dominates housing production in Turkey hardly provide sensitive solutions to such user profiles. Therefore when we think of the housing needs of an academic community member, we start to think of residence in relation to an environment that not only caters to simple residence needs but also to study and research in comfort. As architects we should see beyond housing as an investment measured in square meters and cost, and imagine what makes the life of an academic different than any other user profile.

The way we occupy space when we are under different constraints should affect the character of the space that we design. We should remember that our quality of life does not depend on the size of the spaces that we inhabit but rather on the qualities of its architecture and the way we appropriate those qualities. A house is regarded as a home when we feel a sense of place attachment regarding this house.











Definition of the Project

AR 302 is the fourth architectural design studio of the architectural curriculum at IYTE. So that, students were expected to bring together a variety of knowledge areas that acquired during their previous undergraduate education.

The studio's general out frame theme was concerning global climate change and sustainable design. The design project asked to include proposing an urban analytic approach, configuring the building program and concept parallel to the urban analytic studies, integrating building construction systems with spatial configurations, using multi-media tools to test and express design ideas through diagrams and collages.

Based on these expected performances students evaluated their projects in terms of some design and studio topics; -site analysis (local climate, urban fabric, movement and activities, site context, etc.) develop innovative project concept, form the building mass -sustainable design approach considering (mass, form and orientation, natural light, natural ventilation, material choice, landscaping, heating-cooling strategies, etc. -translation of the project program elements into spatial configurations -system and material solutions in relation to building mass -circulation patterns (vertical and horizontal) and its integration with building structure systems -the use of multi-media as design test tools and graphic communication programs -minimum code requirements (handicap accessibility, height limits, etc.) -material choice and applications -workshops by outside visitors.


The studio general out frame theme is concerning sustainable design of large scale hosing (HYBRID VITALIZER: SUSTAINABLE DWELLING PROPOSAL FOR TIRE) environmentally, economically, and socially. Housing project required parallel design strategy: unite(s) design and total project mass design in order to achieve a successful project. Unit(s) design concern space comfort, natural light, natural ventilation, spatial relationships (privacy), furniture arrangements, spatial dimensions, etc. Total project mass design concern how individual units of different sizes are brought together, how privacy issues are addressed, and how spaces of different functions are inhabited, how housing projects relate to their immediate urban surroundings and how they could create public and semi-public urban spaces.

Each final presentation should have; -conceptual drawings, main idea, scenario sketches, diagrams, photos, individual site analysis, and existing architectural project -site plan 1/500, -floor plans 1/200 showing spaces of the project program location and main service area and main approach entry/entries of the building -minimum two sections 1/200 representing space relations, natural light strategy, solar gain, and air movement strategy -foot print of the building mass in the site with surrounding buildings at June 21 (at 7:00, 12:00, and 18:00) and at December 21 (at 8:00, 12:00, and 16:00) -diagrams representing special idea and view of some spaces of the project -study model(s) 1/200 showing building mass and landscape work -1/200 elevations










Definition of the Project

AR 402 is the last architectural design studio of the architectural curriculum at IYTE. In spring semester 2017, students are asked to develop an architectural design project on the future of the city questioning architecture as provocation in İzmir.

The primary objectives of the studio are as follows: To propose an urban analytic approach; To propose massing solutions in urban scale; To propose a design concept and design with complex building program parallel to the urban analytic studies; To use the knowledge of contemporary structural systems; To use multi-media tools and to express design ideas through diagrams and collages.

ARCHITECTURE AS PROVOCATION

With the theme proposed 'Architecture as Provocation', the students are expected to discuss the search of architecture that can be provocative, innovative, seminal, remarkable, striking and thus a starting point of the transformation the city Izmir.

Course of actions prepared by legal authorities determine the future of the cities.

They sometimes stem from the dynamics of the city which are already progressing or products of brand-new dynamics. Sometimes, change occurs as a result of mixed voices. The studio aims to understand and evaluate architecture as a tool of questioning the future of the cities, development strategies through responding or criticizing spatial proposals.
